
ABOUT KASIM ALI






ABOUT THE AUTHOR

She was the first East-Asian to win the *Poetry London* and Manchester Poetry prizes. She is co-founding editor of *harana poetry*, a magazine for poets who write in English as a second or parallel language, and the founder of *Tsaá with Roma*, an online interview series with poets and other creatives. ABOUT THE AUTHOR



He is currently undertaking a PhD at the University of Strathclyde.

His bestselling debut novel, **THE YOUNG TEAM** (Picador, 2020), is inspired by his experiences. It won a Betty Trask Award, a Somerset Maugham Award, and the Scots Book of the Year 2021. 




ABOUT THE AUTHOR





A dedicated gamer, reader, film and comic-book fan, Kenny is also an ardent advocate for Scotland's Gaelic language and culture, enthusiastically sharing intriguing details of little-known folklore with a wider audience on social media (112,000 followers on TikTok and 124,000 followers on Instagram).

On the acting side, Kenny starred in feature film Lost at Christmas, and appeared in the BBC Scotland sitcom Scot Squad, and BBC Alba's An t-Eilean. He is artistic director of a small theatre company which regularly tours around Scotland performing murder mysteries in castles and stately homes: through this he has performed for many famous names.


When Elle can't bear to hear Thor howling all night, the two agree to strike a deal: she'll dog-sit while he's on shift.


But what starts as a reluctant arrangement soon turns into late-night chats, sizzling chemistry, and two lonely hearts daring to let each other in.



When Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022, Victoria Amelina was busy writing a novel, taking part in the country's literary scene, and parenting her son. Then she became someone new: a war crimes researcher and the chronicler of extraordinary women like herself who joined the resistance. These heroines include Evgenia, a prominent lawyer turned soldier, Oleksandra, who documented tens of thousands of war crimes and won a Nobel Peace Prize in 2022, and Yulia, a librarian who helped uncover the abduction and murder of a children's book author.

Everyone in Ukraine knew that Amelina was documenting the war. She photographed the ruins of schools and cultural centers; she recorded the testimonies of survivors and eyewitnesses to atrocities. And she slowly turned back into a storyteller, writing what would become this book.

On the evening of June 27th, 2023, Amelina and three international writers stopped for dinner in the embattled Donetsk region. When a Russian cruise missile hit the restaurant, Amelina suffered grievous head injuries, and lost consciousness. She died on July 1st. She was thirty-seven. She left behind an incredible account of the ravages of war and the cost of resistance. Honest, intimate, and wry, this book will be celebrated as a classic.



Sixteen-year-old K from the American Midwest experiences the sensual intersection of sex, landscape, identity and language during a summer abroad in Brittany in 1997. K is participating in a prestigious six-week language immersion programme organised by her home state's university. She lives with a host family and attends daily classes with other Americans after signing the programme contract requiring her to speak only French for the duration of the summer. There are a series of other 'Pillars' that govern the philosophy of the programme and therefore her behaviour. Against these rules, K has a love affair — her first grand amour — with the twenty-four-year-old host family 'brother' in the house on the cliff overlooking the sea in Saint-Brieuc.

USE THE WORDS YOU HAVE weaves narration and recollection of K's conservative Italian American family life in Midwestern America, her fascination and struggle with Catholicism, the host family's Breton nationalism, and K's obsession with Arthur Rimbaud and the eternal trinity — sex, the sea and the sun. It culminates in K's return decades later to the same cliffside in Saint-Brieuc. There she discovers that the sea is closed — fenced off with concrete and steel barriers and skull and crossbones signs — due to a deadly green tide caused by climate change and intensive farming, which now returns to the coast every year. The sea, the site of her awakening into sex, language and the self, is closed.

With echoes of André Aciman's CALL ME BY YOUR NAME, Olivia Laing's CRUDO, and told in a style and mood resonant with Deborah Levy's HOT MILK, **USE THE WORDS YOU HAVE** is an atmospheric, sensuous and electric work of autofiction that heralds a bright new talent.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Kimberly Campanello was born in Indiana, and is a dual Irish and American citizen living in York. Her most recent poetry project is MOTHERBABYHOME, a collection of 796 conceptual and visual poems on the St. Mary's Mother and Baby Home in Tuam, Co. 



Hannah and Eric are a successful couple living in North London with their three children, and Eric's father Yosef, a survivor of the camps. They are devout Jews who believe in the literal truth of the Old Testament, all except for their youngest son Tovyah. The death of Yosef — the family's link to pre-war Europe — throws the family into disarray. Elsie, the model daughter, disappears for four days, plunging the family into a living nightmare. When she returns, just as mysteriously as she left, she is strangely altered. 

I find myself wondering what would have happened if I had been more clear. If our relationship had not begun with this one tiny untruth.

Time has flattened for Esther.

Her storybook marriage begins, and ends, in the shadow of Notre Dame cathedral. Sifting through the ashes of their years together, a time now collapsed by grief, she finds a mismatched litany: mountain lions, a Paris bookshop, bad dancing, bad faith, marshland, prairieland, miscarriage, motherhood, bagels, Eve.

In order to understand this new story, Esther seeks help - from generations of women, from a book about evolution, from a friendly philosopher/scientist with a solid grasp of the space-time continuum.

Mostly, though, she writes — fragments, notes, letters — tracing a fine line between a story that soothes and one that suffocates; confronting the impossibility of communicating anything in the right way, at the right moment, to her daughter. Esther writes, and rewrites, until time slowly takes shape again.

This extraordinary debut is an excavation of betrayal, of motherhood, of time and timelessness, of guilt and consequence, of love coming to an end. Told with dry wit and a startling ferocity, AND NOTRE DAME IS BURNING heralds an urgent new voice in literary fiction.

In a small seaside town, autumn is edging into winter, gulls ride winds over the waves, and two women pass each other on the promenade, as yet unaware of each other's existence.

In the nineties Lydia was a teen pop star, letting the world happen to her. Three decades later, the news cycle runs hot with #MeToo stories, and a famous former lover has emerged with a self-serving apology, asking her to forgive him. Suddenly, the past is full of trapdoors she is desperately trying not to fall through.

Joyce, in middle age, still lives with her mother Betty. With their matching dresses, identical hairdos and makeup, they are the local oddballs. Theirs is a life of unerring routine. One misstep from Joyce can ruin Betty's day; so Joyce treads carefully, never thinking about a different kind of life. But recently, along with the hot flushes, something like anger is asserting itself, like a caged thing realising it should probably try and escape.

In a gentrifying run-down seaside resort, these two women might never meet. But as they both try to untangle the damaging details of their past in the hope of a better future, their lives are set on an unlikely collision course.

With mordant wit and lyrical prose, **BIRDING** asks if we can ever see ourselves clearly or if we are always the unreliable narrators of our own experiences. It is a story about third acts and last chances, and two women trying to take flight on clipped wings.
