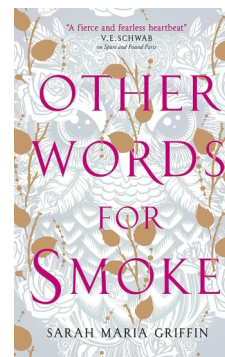
Extract:

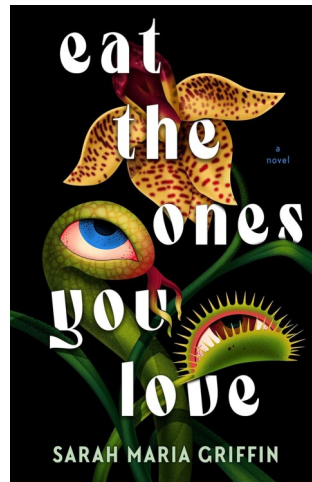

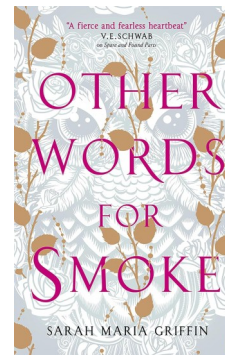

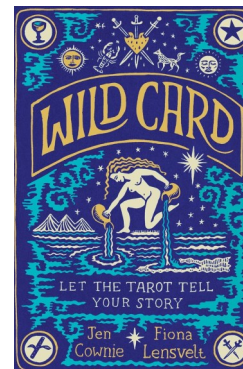
Em swallowed. Her breath was shallow in her chest. She didn't know if she could speak, but she found her voice: dry and quiet as a whisper.

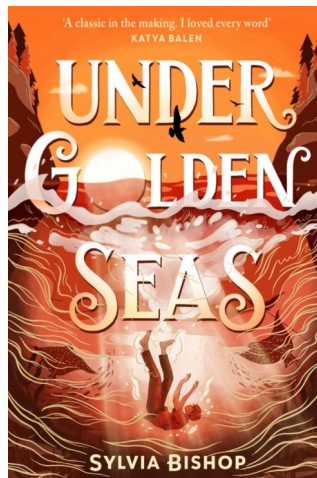




SYLVIA BISHOP
