Written with frankness and wry humour, **A WOMAN LIKE ME** is an inspirational account that celebrates how one woman succeeded against massive odds and built an extraordinary legacy.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Born in London in 1953, Diane attended grammar school and went on to Newnham College Cambridge where she obtained a Masters degree in history.

After working in media, in 1987, Diane made history by becoming the first black woman ever elected to the British Parliament. She has since built a distinguished career as a parliamentarian, broadcaster and commentator.


In 2008, Diane was awarded the *Spectator*/Threadneedle Speech of the Year Award and a Human Rights Award from Liberty. Diane is founder of the London Schools and the Black Child initiative, which aims to raise educational achievement levels amongst black children.


ABOUT THE AUTHOR







ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Graeme Armstrong is a Scottish writer from Airdrie. His teenage years were spent within gang culture. Alongside overcoming his own struggles with drug addiction, alcohol abuse and violence, he defied expectation to read English as an undergraduate at the University of Stirling; where, after graduating with honours, he then achieved a Masters' in Creative Writing. He is currently undertaking a PhD at the University of Strathclyde.

His bestselling debut novel, **THE YOUNG TEAM** (Picador, 2020), is inspired by his experiences. It won a Betty Trask Award, a Somerset Maugham Award, and the Scots Book of the Year 2021. In 2023, Graeme was chosen as one of Granta's *Best of Young British Novelists*, an accolade that is awarded once a decade.

Graeme Macrae Burnet was brought up in Kilmarnock, Ayrshire and now lives in Glasgow. He has also lived in the Czech Republic, France, Portugal and London and has appeared at festivals and events all over the world.

His first novel, THE DISAPPEARANCE OF ADÈLE BEDEAU was published by Saraband, who have published all his novels in the UK. It received a New Writer's Award from the Scottish Book Trust and was longlisted for the Waverton Good Read Award. HIS BLOODY PROJECT (2015) won the Saltire Society Fiction Book of the Year Award, and was shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize and the *LA Times* Book Awards. A second Inspector Gorski novel, THE ACCIDENT ON THE A35, was published in 2017. His most recent standalone novel, CASE STUDY (2021), was longlisted for the Booker Prize and rights have been sold in 22 countries.

His city is in chaos, suffering heavy bombing, and his old boss Drummond persuades him to help investigate a body found in the wreckage of a destroyed building. When the body turns out to be of a German, mutilated to disguise his identity, things get more complicated.

As Gunner investigates, another body appears and he discovers he's not the only one with an interest in the dead men. Two undercover secret service men are also in Glasgow. When he helps one of them, the eccentric Nickerson, out of a jam, he tells Gunner there is a reason the men look so similar. They have been chosen because they look like Rudolf Hess. They are spare lookalikes.

With Nickerson's help, Gunner uncovers a plot by a section of the British Establishment to end the war by appeasement via a meeting with Hess — a meeting so important that Hess is prepared to fly into Scotland. Gunner has to stop the meeting happening: Britain's future is at stake. But the attempt might well cost him his life...

But what caused the explosion? Accident or environmental terrorism? The injured man knows, but he's not talking. The rig's corporate director, Jim Ross, is Carrie's friend, but he is wrestling with both the catastrophic aftermath and his own guilty secrets. But it is only Ross who believes — against all evidence and odds — that Carrie is alive.

As the oil spills spreads, Ross battles to mount a rescue mission to find Carrie. But is his obsession merely a way to try to assuage his own culpability? And what real hope is there that she could have survived?



At the heart of Pico's ideas were questions that he traced through the depth and breadth of human thought, from the ancient Greeks and Egyptians to the medieval Arabs and Jews. He made use of everything at his disposal from Europe's broadening horizons and asked primal questions of himself and the world. Why is it that we can be astonished by beauty? That the hairs on the backs of our necks can be made to stand by intoxicating rhythms and harmonies? That we can be provoked to ecstatic experiences by the simple means of an incantation? In Catholic Italy, the implications of this line of thought were dangerous and provoked violent reactions, suggesting as they did that the notion of the individual might be just as much of an illusion as a flat earth or a geocentric universe. That there may well be notions of the divine other than the Christian God.

During a tempestuous time at the heart of the Italian Renaissance, Pico's life is a testament to intellectual daring, to a human dignity founded in the willingness to think the unthinkable and to peer over the edge of the abyss in search of answers.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Edward Wilson-Lee is a Fellow in English at Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge, where he teaches medieval and Renaissance literature. After growing up in Kenya and Switzerland, he went to university in London, New York, Oxford and Cambridge, living briefly in Mexico and New Orleans in between. When Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022, Victoria Amelina was busy writing a novel, taking part in the country's literary scene, and parenting her son. Then she became someone new: a war crimes researcher and the chronicler of extraordinary women like herself who joined the resistance. These heroines include Evgenia, a prominent lawyer turned soldier, Oleksandra, who documented tens of thousands of war crimes and won a Nobel Peace Prize in 2022, and Yulia, a librarian who helped uncover the abduction and murder of a children's book author.

Everyone in Ukraine knew that Amelina was documenting the war. She photographed the ruins of schools and cultural centers; she recorded the testimonies of survivors and eyewitnesses to atrocities. And she slowly turned back into a storyteller, writing what would become this book.

On the evening of June 27th, 2023, Amelina and three international writers stopped for dinner in the embattled Donetsk region. When a Russian cruise missile hit the restaurant, Amelina suffered grievous head injuries, and lost consciousness. She died on July 1st. She was thirtyseven. She left behind an incredible account of the ravages of war and the cost of resistance. Honest, intimate, and wry, this book will be celebrated as a classic.

Hannah and Eric are a successful couple living in North London with their three children, and Eric's father Yosef, a survivor of the camps. They are devout Jews who believe in the literal truth of the Old Testament, all except for their youngest son Tovyah. The death of Yosef — the family's link to pre-war Europe — throws the family into disarray. Elsie, the model daughter, disappears for four days, plunging the family into a living nightmare. When she returns, just as mysteriously as she left, she is strangely altered. AND NOTRE DAME IS BURNING is the story – told in letters, journal entries and poetic fragments – of Miriam and Ravi, two writers whose storybook marriage breaks down in the aftermath of miscarriage and infidelity.
