We stood side-by-side, unpicking the composition with our eyes until it became easier to understand in our heads. I think that's why I had cried upon seeing it — my brain couldn't catch up with the colossal emotion my body sensed at its magnitude, and its humanness. Il Paradiso was 24 meters across and seven meters tall, the largest painting on canvas in the world. To say it inspired my awe would be to understate it. I was surprised I was able to speak at all. It was... transcendent. The colours, the emotion of it. I felt, on a cellular level, that I was rearranging myself to make room for these new feelings, and the awareness of it, the knowledge that a painting could change me, just like that, was as un-nerving as it was a comfort. Everything could be as it was, until a man from the sixteenth century walks into your sense of self and makes it otherwise.

'It's like a storybook,' I whispered, after some contemplation. The longer we took it all in, the stiller I felt. The art felt divine; I was sure that such a talent could not be simply be from a person. It couldn't be.



Ever since Vervain Hollow burned to the ground, Laura's life has turned to ash.

All the neighbours think she's crazy. She was in a cult, after all. And even after the fire, after they all – all except Vervain, of course – escaped with their lives, Laura still insists that everything she'd been led to believe is real. That magic exists. That Vervain, their strikingly handsome and magnetic leader, was more than simply human.

Now, three years later, Laura is trying to move on from that strange, fantastical, terrifying year, struggling to move through her trauma and the mysterious hold that Vervain had over her (that he still, somehow, has over her). But then Laura's now estranged friend Aliyah calls with news: former acolyte Daniel has gone back to the Hollow, claiming to have received a message from Vervain. Daniel's last communication consisted of three frantic words:

He's still here.

As Laura and Aliyah venture back to the Hollow to find the truth, Laura finds herself reliving that first year. Can everything she remembers possibly be true?

And can she extricate herself from Vervain's influence, or will she finally claim the wonderful and terrifying power he promised her - at any cost?

Extract:

We came up the long driveway to the Hollow. From the back seat I fixated on the gravel track framed by stubby, thrusting trees, revealing at last a corner of the house: Jedediah Drake's fever-dream folly, dropped in the middle of Indiana farmland like an angel crippled by its fall. Aliyah was driving; I couldn't see her face. Joseph, in the passenger seat, tapped his fingers restlessly on the dash.

'Check the windows.' Aliyah's still-unfamiliar braids swung as her head turned. 'I want to know if he's watching.'

Joseph leaned forward. 'Keep driving.'

They weren't talking to me. Aliyah had cleanly ignored me since the moment they picked me up. Joseph had never paid me much attention. But they hadn't brought me for my conversation. I knew I was here as bait.

We drew past the trees, into the open where the house came clear as it had in my nightmares since I left. Vervain Hollow, where part of me had died. The wooden half was a charred skeleton, beams standing out like uneven ribs. The stone half survived, turret still rising high above the roof of the main hall: absurd, in this flat land with its infinite horizon. I had seen it last in summer. Now, in fall, the Virginia creeper burned bright as the flames that had consumed it.

Aliyah and Joseph gasped. I stared between them through the windshield, trying to look as shocked as they did. I wasn't supposed to have seen the Hollow since the fire.

I was afraid they would see through me. But they didn't even look. They were too caught up in the final death of a dream that had once belonged to all of us.

Aliyah stopped the car. She said something to Joseph, and Joseph replied, but the words might as well have been the sounds of birds. In my mind, I was already searching the house for any trace of you.

The house had never been yours. You had settled into its abandoned body like a hermit crab into a scavenged shell: as Jedediah Drake had settled on the land of the Miami, building his mansion here, dragging his daughter Genevieve with him so she could become a ghost. Just as we, now, had become your ghosts: your relics, broken and scattered, marked forever by your touch.

This is not another wild swimming memoir, but the ocean is always in the foreground. This is also not a memoir about war, but conflict is often the backdrop.

HOME SCAR is the literary memoir of Costa-shortlisted author Natalie Hart's search for purpose and belonging, set against the backdrop of a career in two of the biggest challenges of recent decades: global terrorism and the environmental crisis.

Natalie Hart spent her twenties overseas, working as a research and communications expert in conflict and post-conflict zones. In her early thirties, she left that life behind, moved to Cornwall with a job in marine conservation and got a dog to anchor her to a place. But settling was not as straightforward as she had hoped, and she began swimming on her own in the sea at night, seeking out the danger she missed in the very environment she was working to protect.

In HOME SCAR we follow Natalie through dual timelines: in the present day, she battles to create a life in Cornwall and rebuild a difficult relationship with her estranged mother, while trying to resist the pull of escape and adventure abroad. In the secondary arc we follow the reverse, tracing her life from Baghdad to Kabul, Erbil to Tunis, desperate to stay overseas despite the niggling desire to find a place she wouldn't have to leave behind.



Extract:

I stop for a moment, as still as I can, and hold my breath to listen. Nature holds its breath around me, waiting, our ears straining together. Then I hear it. The low powerful noise of what I came here for. The ocean.

I didn't start doing this on purpose. It just happened once, that I finished work late and I came to the sea anyway, and I found the thing that my body had been craving. A feeling from the life I have been trying to leave behind. As I walk down to the water, I anticipate the sting of the cold on my skin, the serene aching numbness that will follow. Most of all, I look forward to the fear.

My dog is impatient. She runs ahead of me, her coat a camouflage, disappearing and reappearing on the path. Still young, she is transformed into a feral creature by the coming of the night. I got her after I moved here, a tiny fearless being who made my heart swell and stop in equal measure. When I say that I got a dog, what I mean to say is that I purchased an emotional anchor. I wanted to tie my own existence to another living thing. I wanted to make it harder to leave.

After the trees and the fields there is a steep slope downwards, then a gate with a rusty hook and hinges that resist as I open it, as if knowing that people should not be coming down to swim at this time. That it is not safe, in the ocean, in the dark, on your own. I step onto the beach with a crunch of stone under foot and my body hums. The water is waiting, grey-blue, dark, calm. The sea does not judge my choice, it will just welcome me in, subsume me, regardless.

I find a place to undress, a spot by the rocks that is revealed only when the tide is low. I peel away my layers and my bare skin glows white against the dark slate of the pebbles, making me feel visible. Exposed. My dog tracks her way across the beach, nose low in the pungent piles of seaweed left from when the tide was high. I pick my way to the water's edge and sharp rocks dig into the soft flesh of my feet. Low waves claw sand and stone back into the water. The evening air is cool.


Sometimes, excitement feels like fear. Sometimes, fear feels like love.


