



Welcome to Poe Cottage... Would you like a tour?

Jonah Peabody takes a job as caretaker and docent for the last home of Edgar Allan Poe in The Bronx, but from the moment he moves into Poe's Basement-where the caretaker must live-he finds himself also living inside a Poe story, stalked by a man who seems to be his doppelganger and who seeks revenge for past misdeeds. Jonah claims to be hunting for his lost sister, but as the narrative shifts between past and present, it's clear that he's not telling us the entire story. What is he hiding and why? Haunted by the violent ghosts of his own family and Poe himself, Jonah must reconcile with his dark past before the dual shadow of guilt and grief buries him alive. Living in Poe's Basement might just be his last chance at redemption. The author himself lived in Poe Cottage many and many a year ago, and POE & I is loosely based on that experience, but this is no memoir. It's pure fiction. Or, as Poe might say, a hoax.

Matthew Mercier is a writer and storyteller living in the woods of the Hudson Valley. He's worked as a tour guide at the Mystic Aquarium, run a youth hostel in Albuquerque, been slimed as a salmon packer in Naknek, Alaska, provided showers for homeless men on the Bowery, and proudly served three years as head docent and caretaker for the Edgar Allan Poe Cottage in The Bronx. He earned an MFA from Hunter College where he taught writing and children's literature. His work has appeared THE BROOKLYN RAIL, MISSISSIPPI REVIEW, GLIMMER TRAIN, ROSEBUD MAGAZINE, CREATIVE NONFICTION, THE FAIRY TALE REVIEW, SHOTGUN HONEY, and MYSTERY TRIBUNE. He's told stories live on stage with The Moth and been heard on NPR's The Moth Radio Hour, as well The Story Collider, RISK and The Truth podcasts. He's been awarded the Leon B. Burstein scholarship from the New York chapter of the Mystery Writers of America, and a residency from the Saltonstall Foundation. Currently, he is writing and producing radio dramas for Radio Free Rhinecliff in Rhinecliff, NY.



MASTER OF RODS AND STRINGS


When Elias learns that his sorcerous uncle is using puppets to torture his sister, he vows to learn the secrets of occult puppetry to achieve vengeance.

Creative work in journals such as APEX and ABYSS, ARROYO LITERARY REVIEW, MARVELS AND TALES, MIDWESTERN GOTHIC, PSYCHOPOMP Magazine, THE SATURDAY EVENING POST, and WRITING TEXAS. He's written two folklore books based on fieldwork – THE TROLL TALE AND OTHER SCARY STORIES and LAUGH WITHOUT GUILT (both collaborations with Birke Duncan) – and the critical book FOLKLORE AND THE FANTASTIC IN NINETEENTH CENTURY BRITISH FICTION (Routledge). 



The horror of grief.




Black magic, high tech, and a terrifying portal opened.


THE FACE YOU WEAR

BAYOU WHISPERS


Get ready for proper New Orleans voodoo.


Trapped in a basement, there's no means of escape, and he's coming ...




Buy a country house, they said.


